A Message from the Manse

I don't want to alarm you, but you might be reading the last issue of Focus Magazine, at least in its current form. With our union with Cornhill and Cullen now becoming a reality, we'll be looking at producing a new, expanded magazine with the news from all three parishes and whether we call it Focus or not, well, that remains to be seen. But we will have a magazine, so don't be too concerned!

It's just one of the changes that'll come with our union and you can read about others elsewhere in these pages, but something I want to assure you is that I'll still be here (although as you've no doubt heard I'll be living in the manse in Cullen eventually) and, more importantly, your church will still be here. I'm afraid that there will be some Sundays when there won't be a service in Portsoy, but what I'd like us all to remember is that just because there isn't one on a particular day that doesn't mean there won't be an opportunity for worship. From the end of January onwards, our church will be Seafield Parish Church of Scotland, Banffshire and we're lucky, we'll have three worship centres, the other two of which aren't far away. Much as we might love our Church Centre, we've got to remember that we don't worship a building. You know the hymn, don't you? 'I am the church, you are the church, we are the church together!' Well, it's true. And it's true that, 'The church is not a building, the church is not a steeple, the church is not a resting place, the church is a people.' It's not the the

bricks and mortar that matter, it's the folks who come through the doors.

In Acts 7:48 we're told 'The Most High God does not live in houses built by human hands.' Oh, I know that on a Sunday morning I'll thank Him in my prayers for being with us, but that doesn't mean because he's with us He's not in Cornhill or Cullen at the same time. We can't constrain Him to any four walls - look up the word 'omnipresent' in your dictionary if you don't believe me...

If you've just done that, you're maybe thinking now, 'Well, if He's everywhere, I could just stay at home and He'll be with me there.' Yes, He will be, and I know that's how some people's relationships with God work so that's totally fine. But if you're used to attending church, you go because you want to be with people too. You go because you want to be a part of a worshipping family. Please don't let a few miles prevent you when the Church Centre is having a Sunday off.

Nothing changes until after the festive season, though, so let's enjoy that first - and let me take this opportunity of wishing you a peaceful and happy Christmas and a blessed New Year! Every blessing

Our New Church

By the time you're reading this, we'll have had our Service of

Union marking the birth of Seafield Parish Church of Scotland, Banffshire, the result of our union with Cornhill and Cullen. Although this means some changes are necessary, it won't be until early next year when we'll see them come into effect. Some of these changes include our schedule of worship, which you can see above up until the end of March, and I'd like to take this opportunity of explaining the thinking behind it. We have one Minister (me!) to cover all three of our centres of worship and, of course, I can't be everywhere at once. Two things are important to me: 1) that the pattern is regular so we can become easily used to it and 2) that my time is split evenly between centres (it's only fair). There are times when I can't

be in two places at once so it's necessary to enlist some help, as you can see - though, in time, I hope we can manage these with suitably trained volunteers from our united congregation. Also, you'll see that rather than monthly joint services, we're now just going to have these when there's a fifth Sunday in the month - that'll be four times a year. As each centre has one Sunday in each 4-week month without a service though, there's plenty of opportunity to get together for worship, as I've talked about in my Message from the Manse in this issue of Focus!

In case you're wondering why nothing changes until the end of January, it's so I can get my holidays in first!

Paul writes in Philippians 3:13-14, "forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal." Our union isn't the end of something; it's the beginning of a shared journey. Together, we can discover new ways to serve, new friendships to cherish, and new opportunities to witness to Christ in our communities.

Do you ever wonder what blessings God might unfold when His people embrace change with faith? In trusting Him, we find courage to step into tomorrow with hope.

Paul reminds us in 1 Corinthians 12:12 too that "just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ." Each of our congregations brings its own gifts, traditions, and stories, but it's when we join hands that we reflect the unity of Christ's people best, showing the world that togetherness is so much better than division. And when His people come together, well, then something special happens. A single candle might give light, but lots of candles brighten the whole room. One voice can sing a hymn, but a choir of voices lift it into harmony.

Gracious God, thank You for the gift of new beginnings. As our churches unite, help us to see the opportunities You place before us. Give us courage to embrace change, patience to walk together, and joy in the journey ahead. May our shared life bear fruit for Your Kingdom, and may we always trust that You are doing a new thing among us.
