A Message from the Manse

At the time you're reading this, Easter Sunday will be just a few days away - or, perhaps, it was a few days ago. Easter comes (or came) early this year, but I wonder if you know why?

The answer is that Easter Sunday falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon following the vernal equinox. Which is all well and good, but what's the vernal equinox? Well, it's the first day of spring, which is usually 21st March - which means that, if there's a full moon on that day, the earliest Easter can possibly be is 22nd March. It does happen, occasionally - very occasionally. None of us were around to see it the last time though, it was back in 1818, and we won't be around to see the next time either, as that'll be in 2285! Even having Easter as early as 31st March is relatively rare - it happened in 2002 and 2013 as well as this year, but the next time won't be until 2086.

And, of course, this year Easter Sunday will be (or was, depending on when you're reading this) an hour shorter than usual, making it all the more unusual.

All of this still doesn't answer why, though, does it? Why can't Easter be on the same day every year? Christmas Day, is, after all. Well, the answer is because Easter Sunday is linked to the Jewish Passover and when the Passover was instigated, astronomy and the state of the moon mattered much more than they do nowadays. That's the short answer - we'd need a few more pages in this issue of Focus if I were to give you the long one! But whatever the reason for the date that Easter falls upon, it remains one of the most important dates - probably the most important - in the Christian calendar. Because it's the day on which our whole belief system is based, the day on which we remember the resurrection of Jesus. It's the day that He rose again. And in our part of the world, whether it's late or early Easter always falls in springtime, a time of renewal and regrowth - so whatever date it falls on, it's the perfect reminder to us that new life, through Jesus, is there for us all.




